CURRICULUM VITAE PROF. KAREL VAN HULLE

Prof. Karel VAN HULLE lectures at the Economics and Business Faculty of the KU Leuven (Belgium), where he is attached to the Insurance Research Centre and at the Economics Faculty of the Goethe University in Frankfurt (Germany) where he is attached to the International Centre for Insurance Regulation (ICIR). He is member of the Insurance and Reinsurance Stakeholder Group of EIOPA and Chairman of the Conflicts of Interests Oversight Committee of the European Money Markets Institute. He is also a member of the Public Interest Oversight Board (since March 2014) and of the Board of the Bermuda Monetary Authority (since January 2016).

He served as Head of Insurance and Pensions at the European Commission until 1 March 2013, where his main task was the development of the new risk based solvency capital regime for (re) insurers (Solvency II). In that capacity, he represented the EC within EIOPA and was a member of the Technical Committee of the IAIS. He joined the EC in 1984 after serving 8 years with the Belgian Banking Commission. Before becoming Head of Insurance and Pensions in 2004, he was responsible at the EC for Accounting, Auditing and Company Law.

Since his retirement from the EC, he has been a regular speaker at insurance and pensions conferences around the world. He has participated in the organisation of several international conferences and has been involved in numerous projects (including for the World Bank and for the Australian supervisor, APRA).

Prof. Van Hulle is a Belgian national. He was born in Leuven on 23 March 1952 and studied law at the KU Leuven and at the Marquette University Law School in Milwaukee (Wisconsin).

He was nominated Distinguished International Lecturer in Accounting by the American Accounting Association in 1990, Distinguished Fellow of the IAIS by the International Association of Insurance Supervisors in 2013 and Honorary Fellow of the UK Institute and Faculty of Actuaries in 2014. In December 2014, he was nominated Honorary Professor at the Goethe University in Frankfurt, where he also serves as executive member of the Board of the International Centre for Insurance Regulation (ICIR).
